Devotional

Take more than just one taste. Feast on His goodness and you will shine with His radiance. Be overrun with confidence in Him. Allowing His presence through you, will draw others unto Himself. Study

Second see Psalm 23:6 (AMP), "Surely goodness and mercy and unfailing love shall follow me all the days of my life, And I shall dwell forever [throughout all my days] in the house and in the presence of the Lord".
